

Too many babies in Berrien County die before their first birthday due to suffocation or asphyxiation from being placed in an unsafe sleep environment. These deaths are 100% preventable. My desire is for all of our church's parents, grandparents, caregivers and babysitters, be exposed to the correct practices and protocol. I have several pamphlets relating to this subject matter available in my office, and all are welcome to stop by and pick one up.

If there is an interest in organizing a program for grandparents or parents here at First Congregational, I'll be happy to get the ball rolling. Please contact me for scheduling this important educational forum. It's provided free from the Berrien County Health Department just for the asking!


